



Action to be taken when a ballistic missile falls

There is also a chance that a ballistic missile will arrive within 10 minutes from launch. If there is a possibility of a missile falling into Japan, emergency information will be announced by early warning e-mail, etc. with the aid of "J-Alert" to convey emergency information from the national government in a split second.

① Prompt evacuation

② Accurate and rapid collection of information

Follow the instructions of the national government and act calmly.

J-Alert

(Example sentences) Missile launch Missile launch A missile was launched from North Korea.

Seek shelter in a building or underground.

If you get the message, act calmly and promptly.

-If you are outdoors: **Seek shelter in a nearby building or underground.**

※ Underground: Underground facilities including underground shopping arcades and subway stations

-If there is no building: **Take cover or drop to the ground and protect your head.**

-If you are indoors: **Move away from the window or move to a room with no windows.**

If a missile fell nearby.

-If you are outdoors: **Move promptly away from the site and evacuate indoors or up wind while covering your mouth and nose with a handkerchief.**

-If you are indoors: **Seal the room by turning off the vent, closing and sealing the windows.**

Reception of J-Alert by smartphone application, etc.

J-Alert is delivered by early warning e-mail, etc. routed through leading mobile-service providers (NTT Docomo, au, SoftBank, etc.) with the exception of some models.

Check if your cellphone or smartphone can receive early warning e-mail, etc.
